



F.A.Q.

1. When is Paris2Nice 2021?

- The proposed date is 10th – 16th September 2021.

2. I have paid my deposit for 2020, what happens to this?

- We hope that most people will wish to take part in Paris2Nice 2021 and we will give priority for Paris2Nice 2021 to those whose deposits remain. However, anyone who has paid full fees or deposit can request to get a refund.

3. I want my deposit to remain as I would like to take part in Paris2Nice 2021, what do I need to do?

- You don't need to do anything. We will automatically roll your registration for Paris2Nice to 2021 unless you tell us otherwise or you can confirm this by emailing Vivienne@paris2nice.com.

4. What if I want my deposit or full payment refunded?

- No problem, please contact Vivienne@paris2nice.com to arrange.

5. I have already booked my flights to Paris and from Nice, what can I do?

- The flights may actually operate so you may not be able to get a refund, however you may be able to change your flights for a later date or a different flight. Currently Aer Lingus are not charging to change dates for flights booked in September. Unfortunately we can't give individual or specific advice, but we recommend that you contact your travel insurance company.

6. For Paris2Nice 2020, there were two events, Paris2Nice Bleu and Paris2Nice Rouge. Will there be two events in 2021?

- We are planning to host only one event next year, however if we have enough demand, we will consider adding another week and places will be offered on both weeks.

7. What happens to my fundraising page?

- For those people who choose to roll-over to 2021, your fundraising page will continue to next year and funds will remain as normal.
- For cyclists who do not wish to roll-over for next year, you may ask for a refund of donations. However we would emphasise that charities have been impacted massively during this difficult period and we would ask that you consider leaving the donations stand.
